

**Michio Sugeno** was born in Yokohama, Japan. He obtained the B. S. degree in physics from the University of Tokyo, Japan, the Dr. Eng. degree from Tokyo Institute of Technology, Japan and the Honorary Doctorate from Polytechnic University of Madrid, Spain, in 1962, 1975, and 1998, respectively.

From 1962 to 1965, he was with Mitsubishi Atomic Power Industry, Tokyo, Japan. From 1965 to 1977 he was a Research Associate of Control Engineering at Tokyo Institute of Technology. From 1977 to 2000, he was an Associate Professor and a Professor of Systems Science at Tokyo Institute of Technology. From 1989 to 1995, he was a Leading Advisor of the Laboratory for International Fuzzy Engineering Research, Japan. From 2000 to 2005, he worked at the Brain Science Institute, RIKEN, Japan as a Team Leader. From 2005 to 2010, he was a Distinguished Visiting Professor at Doshisha University, Kyoto, Japan. Currently he is an Affiliated Distinguished Researcher at European Soft Computing Centre, Mieres-Asturias, Spain.

Dr. Sugeno was President of the Japan Society for Fuzzy Theory and Systems for the term 1991-1993 and also President of International Fuzzy Systems Association for the term 1997-1999. He is a Fellow of International Fuzzy Systems Association. He has received a number of awards including a Lifetime Achievement Award in Soft Computing, World Automatic Congress (1988) and an Outstanding Achievement Award, International Fuzzy Systems Association (2003). He is the first recipient of an IEEE Pioneer Award in Fuzzy Systems with Lotfi Zadeh in 2000. Also he is just going to receive the 2010 IEEE Frank Rosenblatt Award in July, 2010.
